 - © Discussion of the criticisms brought against the Theory.
- (B) Describe what a Daisyworld model is and how they are related to chaos and genetic algorithm principles.
- (C) Given with the test question the unlabeled Daisyworld models we discussed in class, present a sequence of arguments explaining the meaning, significance and implication of each model for dealing with criticism directed at the Gaia Theory, and for understanding the dynamics of ecosystems.
